What you'll do	How you'll do it
Operational Delivery	 Instruct swimming lessons from within the pool, teaching children of all ages how to be safe in the water, how to swim and basic swimming strokes.
	Be responsible for your own class teaching water safety skills to a small group of children
	Provide professional, well-structured and engaging classes which stimulate and challenge participants
	Monitoring of class participation
	 Liaising with parents and caregivers of the children to provide progress updates and answer general questions relating to their child's swimming lessons
	Assisting in the areas of programme administration where required
	Ensure class structure is appropriate to the type of participants
	Ensure all classes start on time, with any equipment prepared in advance
	Report programme details to the Swim School Management as required
	 Use all swim school equipment with care and ensure the equipment is used appropriately during lessons and put away correctly in a tidy manner, report any breakages to the Team Leader Swim School.
	All Swim Instructors will be provided with uniforms that must be worn at all times.
	Assist with small events, such as prizegiving, as directed by the Swim School Management team
	Administering first aid and following emergency procedures when required and in accordance with the pool emergency action plan
	Committing to the roster and being punctual at all times
	Lifeguarding
	For those who are qualified lifeguards, lifeguard shifts can be mutually accepted from time to time and those shifts include these additional duties:
	Undertaking lifeguarding duties providing competent and professional supervision of pool patrons using the facility. Supervision includes scanning poolside in order to prevent accidents from happening, identifying and escalating potential hazards and responding to emergencies in accordance with the pool's emergency action plan
	Utilise first aid, rescue, and resuscitation techniques as a qualified First Aider where required
	Conduct water testing in accordance with the pool's operational standards
Relationship Management	Establish and maintain close working relationships with internal and external stakeholders, ensuring that relationships with key stakeholders are professional, positive and constructive
Corporate Responsibilities	 Willingly undertake any duty required within the context of the position Adhere to our Code of Conduct
	 Undertake civil defence and emergency management tasks as directed including participation in pre-event training and rostered duties during an emergency event
