The Infrastructure group comprises four teams: Parks, Transport, Water Services and Waste. The Group is responsible for a significant portion of the Council's customer interactions and budget spend as people work, live and play in Porirua.

The Parks team looks after Porirua's natural landscapes and the health of Te Awarua o Porirua Harbour to ensure both our people and environment thrive. From our streams, bush and coastal areas to sports fields and shared paths, we manage and regenerate the spaces that define Porirua, and we work in partnership with Ngāti Toa and our community to create safe, welcoming, and ecologically rich places for generations to enjoy.

Your purpose

The Manager Arboriculture's role is to:

- work with both the City Services Team and Transport Team to manage all aspects of Porirua's tree population.
- provide expert advice and technical information to Council, developers, residents, and community groups on all matters relating to arboriculture.
- manage all aspects of the asset management, operational services delivery and plan the development and maintenance of the Porirua's tree population.

Operational Delivery	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide technical arboricultural advice to other council teams including Transport, Resource Consents and Monitoring, and Planning • Lead, promote and educate modern Arboriculture practices within Council, our community, and the region. • Organise and supervise contractors on services not directly provided, to ensure the Council obtains best value • Ensure contractors comply with their Health & Safety Policy and also comply with the Council's own Health & Safety Policy and the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015. • Manage the maintenance and development of Porirua City Council's tree population through staff and external contracts. • Ensure an afterhours process is in place for any call outs, emergency responses or storm events. • Ensure specified service levels for the delivery of arboriculture services are met. • Provide specialist consultation and advice regarding Arboriculture to both internal and external stakeholders and customers. • Monitor and audit service requirements and contracts. • Create and maintain a tree asset management database. • Undertake civil defence and emergency management tasks as directed including participation in pre-event training and rostered duties during an emergency event.
